**A Great MBA Experience for Northwest Suburban Professionals Just Got Even Better:  
Lake Forest Graduate School of Management to Relocate its Schaumburg Campus  
to 1300 E. Woodfield Road by End of 2010**

*After serving Chicago's Northwest Suburbs for 22 years, Lake Forest Graduate School of Management (LFGSM) takes its commitment to the Schaumburg area a step further by building a new state-of-the-art campus for its MBA students in the heart of the business district.*

LAKE FOREST, ILL. (July 13, 2010) — In April, Lake Forest Graduate School of Management (LFGSM) announced plans to relocate its Schaumburg campus from its current location inside the Motorola Galvin Center (1295 East Algonquin Road). After 22 years at the Galvin Center, LFGSM's Northwest Suburban campus will be moving to 1300 E. Woodfield Road (at the intersection of Woodfield and Meacham). The new campus will occupy 14,000 square feet on the building's sixth floor, and is expected to open in late November 2010.

This new campus location puts LFGSM students in the heart of the Schaumburg business district, with easy access from major highways and roads. The multi-tenant building in which the new campus will be located — Woodfield Corners — may be recognizable to area residents who are familiar with the building's signage that indicates major tenant Texas Instruments.



The campus space is being specifically tailored to provide a best-in-class learning experience and will occupy the sixth floor of Woodfield Corners. The campus will offer amenities that include five state-of-the-art classrooms, conference rooms, breakout rooms, and spaces for studying, dining and relaxing. The building offers ample, free parking and an upscale vending and lounge area.

Schaumburg is the largest center of economic development in the State of Illinois, outside the City of Chicago. The business district is home to many leading corporations, thousands of businesses, and a booming retail and commercial area. "We're thrilled to offer a new location in this region that will be easily accessible and provide better visibility for the School," said John Popoli, LFGSM President & CEO. "I'm confident that our students, faculty, staff and alumni will

agree that the new location is an appropriate setting for the results-oriented business education we provide.”

### **Construction to Commence; New Space to Offer Attractive Amenities**

The building at 1300 E. Woodfield has been completely remodeled both inside and outside. It is owned/managed by Crossroads Development Partners, and LFGSM has partnered with Nevin Hedlund Architects, Inc., of River Forest, IL, to design the new campus. The build-out of the space is being managed by Jones Lang LaSalle, and LFGSM was represented by Studley, Inc., during its facility search and lease negotiation procedures. Construction will commence in the coming weeks.

LFGSM’s new campus space in Schaumburg will be professional and contemporary, with design elements that create a welcoming and collaborative educational environment. The use of furniture and technology will be governed by the ways in which business professionals are collaborating today. Sustainability concepts will be incorporated into the selection of lighting, materials, ventilation and layout.

The new Schaumburg campus is expected to begin serving LFGSM’s MBA students and executive education clients before the close of the year. The School will commemorate the grand opening with a public open-house event, for which additional details will be available at [www.LFGSM.edu](http://www.LFGSM.edu) later this fall.
